## Year-At-A-Glance

With generous community support, the Bountiful Community Food Pantry made a tangible difference in the lives of many of our neighbors. See below for brief highlights from this past year. All numbers are FY22 unless otherwise noted.

### **Food – *relieving hunger is our core mission***

- Collected, sorted and distributed approximately 2,000,000 lbs of food or roughly 1.7M meals
- Diverted 906,221 lbs of food from going to waste between Grocery Rescue and Bangerter Farms

### **Clients – *the majority of our clients are below 125% poverty level\****

- 10,191 household visits, representing 35,377 individuals, between our marketplace and mobile pantries

### **No Hunger Zone – *partnering with schools to fight child hunger\*\****

- Partnered with Davis School District and local charter schools helping approximately 80 schools
- Provided 95,000 Pantry Packs (21-22 school year)
- Supported 5 School Pantries

### **Other Services – *going beyond food***

- Sub-for-Santa Dec '22 brightened Christmas for 1076 needy children
- \$4875 Deseret Industries vouchers
- \$2302 in gas cards

### **Volunteers – *they make this place sing, literally!***

- 211 weekly volunteers
- 30,355 volunteer hours, equivalent to more than 14 full-time employees

### **Finances – *we make every dollar count***

- A full 96.8% of our budget goes directly to programs
- >93% funding from contributions directly from the community (individuals and businesses)

### **New Initiatives – *always improving***

- Updated data systems for client and financial management
- Mobile Pantry Program (now hosting about 20 per month)
- Partnered with Open Doors to provide in-pantry help to our clients for rent assistance referrals for other, non-food needs

### **Awards/Recognition – *celebrating progress***

- Community Advocate Award, Davis Technical College
- Community Resource Recognition, People Helping People
- Best of Bountiful

\* Federal Poverty Level is \$30,000 for a family of four

\*\* Nearly 16,000 students (over 20%) of Davis School District students qualify for free or reduced lunch with more than 1200 students experiencing homelessness
